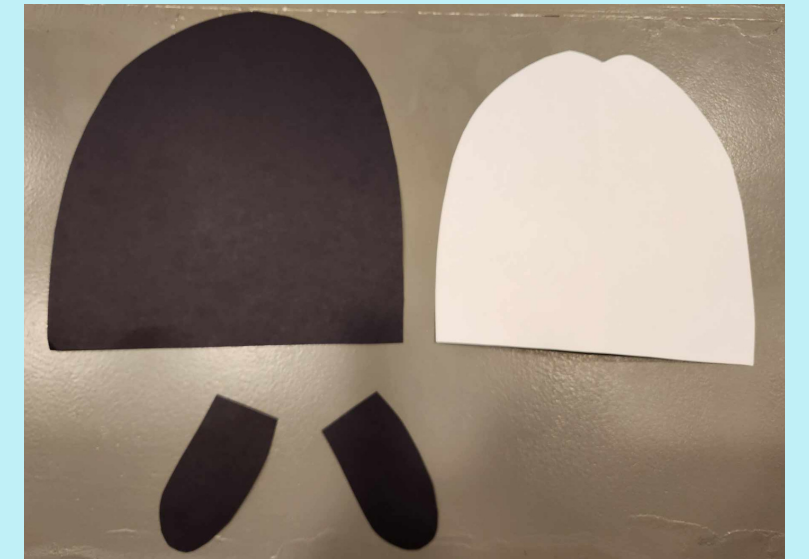


Waterproof Penguin

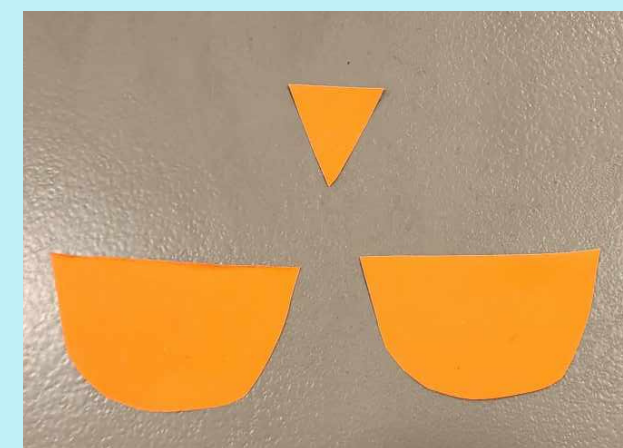
Materials: 1 orange piece of paper, 1 white piece of paper, 1 black piece of paper, black crayon, white crayon, scissors, glue stick, blue food dye (optional), water, cup, straw



Step 1: Cut out a black body and wings from the black piece of paper. Cut the white paper to be the same shape, but slightly smaller than the black body. Add a dip on the curved part.



Step 2: Cut out a beak and feet from the orange paper.



Step 3: Glue the white part onto the black body. Glue the wings, feet, and beak onto the penguin. Use the crayon to add eyes to your penguin.



Step 4: Use your white crayon to waterproof your penguin. Color your penguin 2-3 times with the crayon, making sure to cover every spot.



Step 5: Put water into your cup and mix in a few drops of blue food dye.



Step 6: Use a straw to suck up some of the water (be careful not to suck it all the way up the straw) and then drop the water on your penguin. An adult can help you with this step.

Step 7: The wax from the crayon should have created a waterproof sealer on your penguin and the water should form puddles on your penguin.
